- _____ a. The application required by the College of Education. This is due early the semester *before* you intend to begin taking your Block I education courses on the next page. Fall semester deadline is early February; spring semester deadline is mid-September. **You must complete the Praxis I exam before applying** (allow 6+ weeks to receive your score); Education prefers that you take ED-CIFS 201 and ED-TECH 202 before applying as well. - _____ b. All required courses. The department will not approve enrollment in more than two courses concurrent with student teaching.
- _____ b. At least one American literature and one British literature course, either lower or upper division.
- _____ c. A speech communication class. (Recommended: COMM 101 or 102; may also be used in Core Area II.)
- _____ d. A 2.50 cumulative GPA, a 2.75 GPA in the major (ENGL & LING), and a 3.0 GPA in Education courses.
- _____ e. Idaho teaching certification requirements.
